Find a sign of bird activity, like a nest, feather, or poop.

Identify a tree that grows in your yard or neighborhood.

Make a list of the resources that people get from trees.

Set a timer for 5 minutes and count the birds you see in that time.

Give a tree a hug and tell it why you're thankful for it!

Make an art project using pine cones, twigs, acorns, or bark.

Watch a robin hunt for worms in the grass.

Name five types of fruit that grow on trees.

Plant a tree or shrub with your family.

Build (or hang up) a birdhouse.



Put out a bird feeder or a bird bath in your yard.

Make rubbings of tree leaves or bark using the side of a crayon.

Identify a bird by its song or call.

Collect fallen tree leaves of three different shapes.



Sit at the base of a tree and take a photo of the canopy from underneath it.

Imitate a bird's song that you hear.

Make a drawing or painting of your favorite tree.

Find a tree with leaves that aren't green.

Write a poem about birds.



Spot a bird that is a primary color (red, blue, or yellow).

Read a book about a tree or bird.

Count the number of rings in a tree stump (tip: start in the center and work your way out).

Name three types of birds that you might find on a farm.

Find an evergreen tree. Bonus: can you identify it?
